## List of Accepted Wastes

### **Wastes from dairy products industry**

*Materials unsuitable for consumption or processing* 02 05 01

Including solid and liquid dairy products, milk, food processing wastes, yoghurt, and whey.

*Sludges from on-site effluent treatment* 02 05 02

Restriction: Biological sludge only

### **Wastes from the baking and confectionary industry**

*Materials unsuitable for consumption or processing* 02 06 01

Including condemned food, food processing wastes, biscuits, chocolate, yeast, bread, bakery wastes.

*Sludges from on-site effluent treatment* 02 06 03

Restriction: Biological sludge only

### **Wastes from production of alcoholic and non-alcoholic beverages (except tea, coffee and cocoa)**

*Wastes from washing, cleaning and mechanical reduction of raw materials* 02 07 01

– Including brewing waste, food processing waste, fermentation waste

*Wastes from spirits distillation* 02 07 02

Restriction only:

– Spent grains, fruit and potato pulp

– Sludge from distilleries

*Materials unsuitable for consumption or processing* 02 07 04

Including brewing waste, food processing waste, fermentation waste, beer, alcoholic drinks and fruit juice

*Wastes not otherwise specified* 02 07 99

Restriction Only:

– Malt husks, malt sprouts, malt dust

– Spent grains

– Hops

– Yeast and yeast like residues

– Sludges from the production process

### **Wastes from pulp, paper and cardboard production and processing**

*Fibre rejects, fibre-, filler- and coating-sludges from mechanical separation* 03 03 10

Restriction: Only allowed if not mixed with, or does not contain, de-inking sludge.

*Sludges from on-site effluent treatment other than those mentioned in 03 03 10* 03 03 11

Restriction: Only allowed if not mixed with, or does not contain, de-inking sludge.

### **Wastes from the textiles industry**

*Organic matter from natural products (for example grease, wax)* 04 02 10

#### **Packaging (including separately collected municipal packaging waste**

*Paper and cardboard packaging* 15 01 01

Restriction: Not allowed if any non-biodegradable coating or preserving substance present.

### **Aqueous liquid wastes destined for off-site treatment**

*Aqueous liquid wastes other than those mentioned in 16 10 01* 16 10 02

Restriction: Allowed only if digestate from an aerobic digestion process that accepts only the waste input types allowed by this Quality Protocol.



## List of Accepted Wastes

### **Wastes from physico/chemical treatments of waste**

*Premixed wastes composed only of non-hazardous wastes* 19 02 03

Restriction: Acceptable only if derived solely from input types allowed by this Quality Protocol and remains segregated from, and uncontaminated by, any other waste type.

### **Wastes from the aerobic treatments of wastes**

*Non-composted fraction of municipal and similar wastes* 19 05 01

Restriction: Acceptable only if derived solely from input types allowed by this Quality Protocol and remains segregated from, and uncontaminated by, any other waste type.

*Non-composted fraction of animal and vegetable waste* 19 05 02

Restriction: Acceptable only if derived solely from input types allowed by this Quality Protocol and remains segregated from, and uncontaminated by, any other waste type.

*Off-specification compost* 19 05 03

Restriction: Acceptable only if derived solely from input types allowed by this Quality Protocol and remains segregated from, and uncontaminated by, any other waste type.

*Wastes not otherwise specified* 19 05 99

Restriction: Allowed only if:

- liquor/leachate from a composting process that accepts only the waste input types allowed by this Quality Protocol; or
- digestate from an aerobic digestion process that accepts only the waste input types allowed by this Quality Protocol.

### **Municipal wastes - Separately collected fractions**

*Paper and cardboard* 20 01 01

Restriction: Not allowed if any non-biodegradable coating or preserving substance present.

*Biodegradable kitchen and canteen waste* 20 01 08

*Edible oil and fat* 20 01 25

### **Garden and park wastes (including cemetery waste)**

*Biodegradable waste* 20 02 01

Including animal faeces, manure, garden waste, green waste, horticulture waste, plant tissue, parks and garden waste, hedge and tree trimmings, grass cuttings and leafy materials.

### **Other municipal wastes**

*Mixed municipal waste* 20 03 01

Restriction: Allowed only if separately collected biodegradable wastes otherwise allowed by this Quality Protocol. If former foodstuffs are packaged, the restrictions given above on packaging wastes apply.

*Waste from markets* 20 03 02

- Restriction: Allowed only if source segregated biodegradable fractions. Examples are plant material, fruit and vegetables
- Restriction: Packaging waste from a market source is allowed only if it is otherwise allowed by this Quality Protocol.



## **New Waste Delivery Information**

### **Waste Transfer Note (WTN) Essentials**

Each item on the following list must be included on a waste transfer notes to satisfy the requirements of the Duty of Care Regulations. Each load delivered must have its own WTN.

- Waste Hierarchy Declaration
- Unique Waste Transfer Note number
- Waste description and EWC/LoW code (European Waste Catalogue/List of Wastes)
- Delivery Vehicle registration number
- Waste containment method
- Haulier company name, address and contact details
- Waste Carriers License number
- Disposal location address (minimum 'Langage AD, PL7 5AY')
- Date of waste transfer
- Haulier signature and print name
- Receivers signature and print name
- Document to be filled out in triplicate; 1 copy to be retained by premises of origin, 1 copy to be retained by transporter and 1 copy to be retained by premises of destination – all for 2 years.

\*\*For waste containing Animal By-Products (ABP), additional information is required on the Waste Transfer Note to comply with Animal By-Products Regulations.

- Estimated weight
- Waste source(s) with full address(es)
- ABP Category declaration (only 'CAT 3' accepted)

Vehicles delivering CAT 3 ABP's must also clearly display a sign stating;

**“ Food Waste CAT 3 Animal By-Product – Not for Human Consumption “**

A print out of this sign is included in this document (page 6). Hauliers delivering ABP wastes must be registered as ABP carriers with Animal and Plant Health Agency (APHA). An Animal Health officer inspects Langage AD on a quarterly basis - should any document not contain all required information, as a standard course of action APHA will enquire into any non-compliance issue further.

### **Season Tickets**

Where a single waste stream is delivered, a supplier may opt to produce a single 'season ticket' to cover all deliveries over a year. Please contact us for more information if you wish to produce a season ticket. Please note ABP CAT 3 wastes must have their ABP paperwork requirements uniquely with each load. This is easily achieved with a 'run sheet' with all addresses listed.

### **Contamination**

Langage AD specialise in de-packaging food wastes. However suppliers will be subject to additional charges or have loads rejected if large items of contamination are discovered and removed from delivered wastes. Any suspected chemical contamination such as detergents, bleaches, antibacterial agents, strong acid/bases etc within the waste must be declared prior to delivery. Undeclared chemical contamination causing damage to the facility's biological process will be subject to additional charges and rejection of further loads. Samples of waste may be requested prior to delivery.

### **Delivery**

Deliveries must be made in sealed, fit for purpose vehicles. Vehicles should not be leaking or emanating odours. All waste delivery vehicles must be registered with a Waste Carriers License. Hauliers delivering ABP wastes must be registered as ABP carriers with APHA. Site traffic is speed limited to 5 miles per hour.



## WASTE DELIVERY PROCEDURE

1. Enter through right hand gate signed 'LANGAGE AD' (entry/exit) and pull up on the weighbridge. Be wary of pedestrians.
2. On arrival, produce a valid Waste Transfer Note at the weighbridge window (loads not able to do so will be turned away)
3. Weigh in, typically with driver out of the cab.
4. Await load inspection and notification of acceptance or refusal of load by Langage AD operator
5. If load is accepted, enter waste reception hall on foot to open the main vehicle entry door - switch is located to the left hand side of door.
6. Reverse into reception hall, taking care of operators. There is a large waste reception pit at the end of the hall runway – a door and wheel stops are in place.
7. Close the main reception hall door behind you before opening the reception pit door.
8. Tip waste into reception pit
9. Wheel and vessel washing facility is available once loads are tipped and pit door has been closed.
10. Proceed from waste reception hall to weighbridge and return to shut the main door.
11. Weigh out and complete waste transfer documentation before site is vacated. DO NOT REMOVE PAPERWORK FROM AN UNATTENDED WEIGHBRIDGE OFFICE.

**NB: Langage AD is a strictly no-smoking facility**
